Ministry Assignment: working with Wade Bradshaw, Pastor for Mission

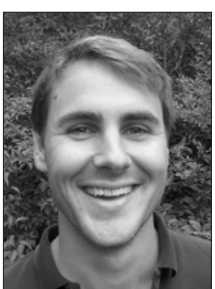
